COVID-19 Cases Update

St. Joseph County- As of today, the county's total number of confirmed cases is at 972. We are confirming two new deaths related to COVID-19 infection bringing our County's total deaths to 35.

The St. Joseph County Department of Health urges the continuation of the following actions:

- **Practice extreme physical distancing.**
 - Maintain at least 6ft between individuals.
 - Wearing a mask does NOT eliminate the need for physical distancing.
